Toxicity Provisions

- Statewide Plan
- Supersedes State Implementation Policy & Portions of Basin Plans
- Establishes:
 - Numeric water quality objectives for toxicity
 - Consistent data analysis method
 - Implementation Plan

Toxicity Provisions Implementation

- Non-Stormwater NPDES Dischargers
 - Species sensitivity screening
 - Reasonable potential
 - Effluent limitations
 - Monitoring frequency
 - Toxicity reduction evaluation
- Stormwater & Non-point Source
 Dischargers Use TST

Toxicity Provisions Schedule

- Draft released on October 19, 2018
- Comments due December 21, 2018
- Revised Provisions release: May 31, 2019
- Staff workshops: June 3 & 24, 2019
- Board workshop: July 2/3, 2019
- Board adoption: September 2019

Sanitary Sewer System Order

- Existing order (2006)
 - Sanitary sewer management plans
 - Local agency internal audits
 - Monitoring & reporting spills
- Staff evaluated:
 - Municipalities' permitting needs
 - Regional Board needs
 - Update requirements with current system design and asset management standards

SSS Order Implementation

- Many system owners upgraded local sanitation programs
- Professional organizations providing training & certification
- Local boards providing resources
- Regional Boards formally enforcing
- 3rd parties pursuing remediation of recurring spills

SSS Order Proposed Reissuance

- Requirements focused on spill volume
- Improve data quality
- Enhance order enforceability
- Incentivize order compliance
- Effective planning for system resilience
- Regulate large private sewer systems and large laterals

SSS Order Reissuance Timeline


- Staff prepare draft order and publicly notice for comment
- Board hearing during comment period
- Staff considers comments and prepares final draft order
- Adoption currently proposed for 2020

Recycled Water Policy

- Amendment adopted December 11, 2018
- Effective date: April 8, 2019
- Three executive orders to be issued June 2019
 - Updates to monitoring and reporting requirements:
 volumetric electronic reporting

Recycled Water Reporting Requirements

- Annual reporting of monthly volumes for:
 - Influent
 - Production treatment level
 - Discharge to inland surface waters, ocean, estuaries, natural systems, underground injection wells, land

Recycled Water Reporting Requirements

• Annual reporting of <u>annual</u> volumes for:


Non-Potable Reuse:

- Agricultural Irrigation
- Landscape Irrigation
- Golf Course Irrigation
- Commercial
- Industrial
- Geothermal Energy Production
- Other Non-Potable Uses

Potable Reuse:

- Groundwater Recharge
- Seawater Intrusion Barrier
- Reservoir Water Augmentation
- Raw Water Augmentation
- Other Potable Uses
